Mary McLeod Bethune, an African American, was born on July 10, 1875 in Maysville, SC. She was number 15 of 17 children. She graduated from Scotia Seminary (now Barbara Scotia College) in Concord, NC. She was an Educator and Civil Rights Activist. Bethune founded the Daytona Normal and Industrial Institute in 1904, which later merged and became Bethune-Cookman College. She died in 1955. The SC Highway Department is selling License Plates in memory of her for \$54.00, of which \$30.00 will go toward missions.

We have met the much requested opportunity for more flexibility in scheduling. This year you will have a choice of a four-day or two-day school. You will have the choice of the traditional four days of in depth mission study paired with the slower paced afternoons filled with options like time to shop at the craft room, to visit the resource room for a new favorite book or have a one-hour short course. Or, you may choose the faster paced two days of intense mission study beginning on Friday morning at 10:00 and ending on Saturday at lunch. The cost of the two day option, of course, is less than that of the traditional four day Mission u. We believe that this two-day choice will allow more care givers, mothers with small children, pastors, and working women and men to attend this wonderful mission education opportunity.

Most or our residents are newly employed and are paying probation fees, fines, court costs, and child support or other debts.

We always encourage them to do this as a practice of healthy and appropriate personal and social responsibility.

Hello,

My name is Rebecca and I am the foster family recruiter for Miracle Hill Ministries. Did you know there are around 1500 children in need of foster care in the Upstate and only about 500 foster families? That means children are being place outside of their communities, in less than ideal situations, and even in group homes, due to lack of families. Having fostered 25 teen girls myself, I firmly believe fostering is a way for Christians to answer God's call to care for the fatherless. What a way to build the Kingdom, by pouring God's love into a child. Planting a seed which will not only stay in their hearts, but be passed on to their biological families, friends and communities as they return with God's love in their lives.

Foster care to me is so similar to the good news of the gospel of Christ Jesus. We were dead in our addictions, sins and bondage, without acceptance, without security and without significance. The good news is that Christ's sacrifice for us changed all of that as we were adopted into God's family. Transformed into a new creation, made alive in God and to God!

In our efforts to get the word out to Christians that foster parents are desperately needed, we are asking women's ministries to help us. We can come and speak at a meeting, to a Sunday School class or home group, hold an informational meeting, or host a table with information. Please let us know if you are interested in partnering with us in the effort to provide Christian families for children in

need.

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
