a visit made by Susan, Rev. Kurt Stutler and Carol Burdette (President of the United Way of Anderson County) to Triune Mercy Center in Greenville, plans began to formulate around establishing a church and ministry in this location that like Triune works with and alongside those dealing with homelessness and poverty.

The project was selected as a recipient of new church start support from the SC Annual Conference and Rev. Kurt Stutler was appointed in June as the founding pastor. Sunday morning worship with a diverse congregation is averaging 65 in attendance proving that it is possible for God's people to become one family across social and economic boundaries. A fellowship dinner supported by several area churches, non-profits and businesses is held every Sunday after worship.
